PIG CONTROL (TUARAN AREA) BY-LAWS 1956 (G.N.S. 76 of 1956)

In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by paragraph *(a)* of subsection (1) of section 56 and paragraph (7) of subsection (1) of section 15 of the Rural Government Ordinance, the Resident, West Coast Residency, has made the following by-laws:

Title and application.

1. These by-laws may be cited as the Pig Control (Tuaran Area) By-laws 1956 and shall apply in those areas lying within a quarter mile of either side of the following paths and road -

- (1) Bolong Bridle Path;
- (2) Tajau Bridle Path;
- (3) Tanjong Bridle Path; and
- (4) Mengkabong Road.

Pigs to be continuously penned.

2. All persons keeping pigs shall keep such pigs continuously penned.

Penalty.

3. Any person failing to comply with these By-laws shall be liable to a fine of twentyfive ringgit for a first offence and to a fine of one hundred ringgit for a second or any subsequent offence.
